All my dog and cat know is that mom and dad are now home, a lot more. For my cat, when mom and dad came home in the past it meant it was dinner time. Now, every time she sees us she thinks its time to eat. Our retirement has thrown off her feeding schedule. While the dog is enjoying a lot more snuggle time, having us home all the time has resulted in some confusion on his routine. When does he go for a walk, who does he walk with, what about nap time? Changes.

When change occurs, whether it is small or large, you need to take into account how that change may affect your animals too. So what can you do to ensure that change doesn't have a negative impact on your animals? Talk to them. Yes, I said talk to them. You may have to repeat the information several times in order for the message to be clearly received.
